The Blue Lamp Trust was established in May 2010 to ensure that the Bobby Scheme had a sustainable future.

The right, which many of us would take for granted, to feel safe in our own home is precious indeed. Hampshire Constabulary, Hampshire Fire & Rescue Service and the Trustees of the new Trust were determined to make this a reality. I am delighted to say that the Trust served its 10,000th client in November 2015; you can meet the delightful lady in

question on our website. We have increased the number of Bobby fitters so that we now have four in Hampshire and one part-time on the Isle of Wight.



The concept of the Trust was that we should enhance safety on the roads as well as in the home and we have continued to offer driver training for business drivers. It can be difficult for businesses to populate classroom courses, so in response to customer demand we have developed three e-Learning modules which are already available for customers, assisted by an engaging character called Bobby. We also provide taxi pre-licensing on-road driving checks to all but one local authority in Hampshire, another vital enhancement to safety on our roads.

The Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Service have continued to be great supporters of the Trust. But I also want to thank the many Hampshire businesses who have contributed to the Trust's welfare by purchasing driver training or by sponsoring cars and other hardware and also events. It would not have been possible without you.

Finally I want to pay tribute to the General Manager, Jim Bettley, and his team at the Trust who in an excellent year have built on the solid foundations to ensure the Trust has continued to grow and develop.

Grants

The Trust made grants in 2015 totalling £5,450

The Trust continues to provide small grants to help community groups, charities and other organisations for projects in line with the Trust's aims and objectives. In 2015 the Trust made grants totalling £5,450



£2,000 Y Services for Young People provide a pathway for disadvantaged young people to develop the capacity and skills to better participate in society, dealing with issues such as alcohol abuse, drugs and anti-social behaviour.

E2,000 The Moving on Project delivers counselling to young people who are victims of crime to help them overcome issues such as severe anxiety, bullying as well as

areas such as being on the autistic spectrum or the death of parents.

Bobby Scheme



Since 2010 the Blue Lamp Trust Bobby Scheme has continued to provide free home security and fire safety visits to the elderly, vulnerable or victims of crime. In November 2015 the trust reached the magnificent milestone of 10,000 home visits. The recipient of this visit, Nita Goodrum, was the guest of honour at a celebratory breakfast event attended by the Chief Constable and the Chief Fire Officer.

The Bobby Scheme has been strengthened by the generous support of the Hendy Group, who have sponsored a Transit Connect van, and the Hampshire Making Safe Scheme, who have ensured the Blue Lamp Trust are able to meet the salary of an extra fitter. This has not only increased the visits the Trust can make



but also reduced our response time to the elderly and the vulnerable.


